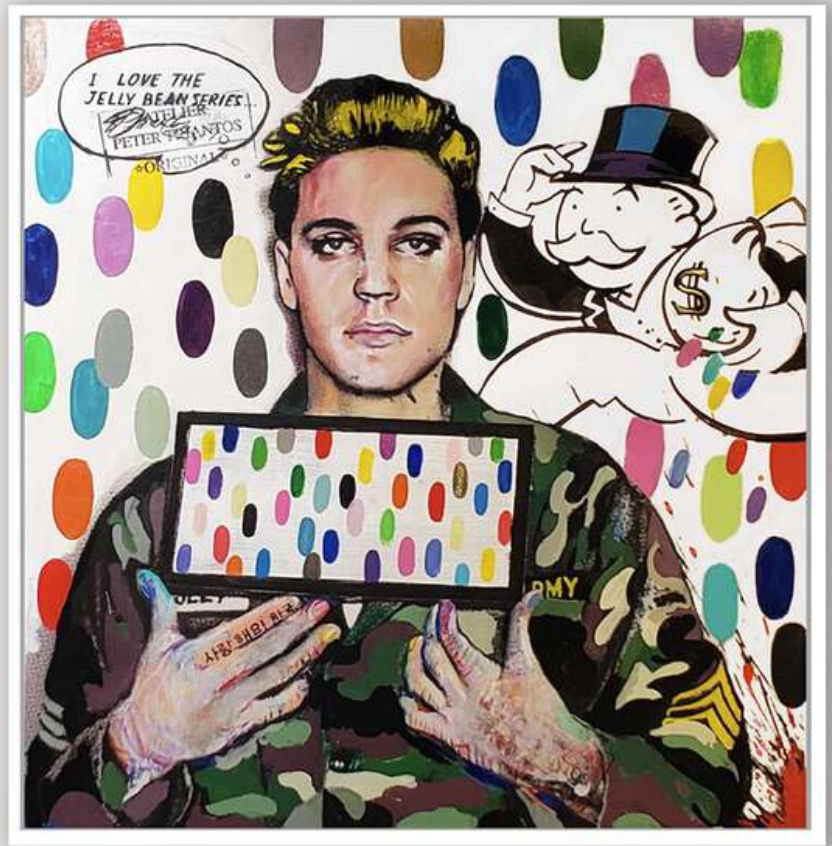





Contemporary abstract artist Peter Triantos believes art should be passionate, vibrant and joyful. And the whole world agrees. Although he's based in Toronto, you'll find his high-end fine art in residential and corporate spaces in private collections, model suites and major lobbies across North America, Europe and Asia

Who knows what might have happened if Peter Triantos had never met his muse. One thing is for sure: the world might never have had the pleasure of laying eyes on some of Triantos's most magnificent pieces. "For me, Seraphina, my wife, played a very important role in the blossoming of my art — she sparks everything," he says. "Of course, I was an artist before that time, but it plays a big role when you have somebody who absolutely backs you." Actually, he says, his work exploded because of her.

Seraphina may light the fire, but it's Triantos's sense of wonder and his passion for, well, life, really, that fuels his art. Take, for example, his

Jelly Bean series, a visual delight of colour, positive energy and pure joy. Or his *Napa Valley* series, which captures the essence of nature on canvas. "The paintings took me there on a journey," he says, speaking of this special place for him.

In fact, it's all part of the journey for Triantos, whose art has taken him literally around the world, from the United States and Europe to Korea and New Zealand. Unfortunately, because of the pandemic, solo shows in Greece and London were postponed this past year. But Triantos isn't the kind of guy to sit still and worry about that. He's already looking ahead to a group show that's being planned in Dubai. "You know what? You cannot really plan, he says. "There has

to be room for error. If you knew everything, how could there be room for creativity?" he asks.

As for this past year, not only has Triantos survived, but he has also thrived. He has continued to expand, opening up new galleries in Toronto, including one that will be throwing open its doors in Yorkville. "We've got a 3,000-square-foot gallery; it's a huge space. And we just opened a 6,000-square-foot gallery at the Yorkdale Shopping Centre. We've received so many compliments from so many art lovers who have visited our new Yorkdale location," he says. "That is going to be a tremendous launch that was six months in the making, trying to sign all the leases." And as soon as the lockdown

It seems to me that many artists, young and old, are prisoners of their emotions. Not Triantos; I can imagine this brilliant painter scaling a 12 foot barbed wire fence just to face his emotions, and welcoming the chance to share them with joy and love. In fact, when I asked him how he faces a blank canvas, he responds: "My energy transfers onto the canvas. It's the energy, passion, vibrance, speed, stuff like that, immediate thinking. I don't ponder and fixate on things. I have zero fear and I immediately attack."

No fear, I like that. And I can see it in his work. He has a certain je ne sais quoi. So, of course, I had to dig deeper into who this incredibly popular artist, Peter Triantos, really is.

Triantos was born in Romiri, a small, tranquil village in the mountains of Greece, where the olive trees grow in abundance. He immigrated with his family to Canada at the age of 5. He recalls the trans-atlantic voyage with great enthusiasm, arriving in Halifax, Nova Scotia, in 1966. What an adventure for a young boy! Even at that tender age he could see the magical dreamland in art.

Little did he know that his journey would take him to be one of the most highly respected and admired Canadian artists of our time.

In middle school, playing with paint and colour in art class, he knew that he was destined to be an

artist. While most of us were simply playing with crayons (I was not half-bad with finger painting!), Peter was planning his future. From the very first moment that he touched paint, it brought him tremendous joy. And he already had a grasp on the power and influence that continues to define his life: ART.

However, like the Beatles song of 1970, it was a "Long and Winding Road" for Peter. There were challenges. I'm reminded of a powerful quote by Maya Angelou:

"Life is pure adventure, and the sooner we realize that, the quicker we will be able to treat life as art."

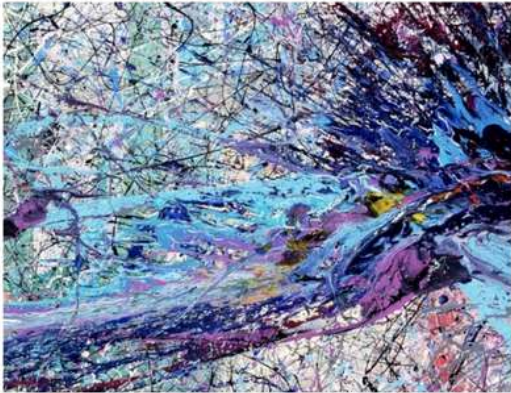

Artist Peter Triantos | The Quintessential Quest For Colors And Passion Beyond Borders

A spectacular weekend in June in Toronto created the perfect canvas for my meet and greet with artist Peter Triantos, a moment in time that would become an extremely inspiring and emotionally charged encounter. Way beyond his skilled approach to colors, the very prolific artist is a super-human with unmatched energy and buoyant passion, someone you would expect to see on stage giving a TED-talk on the power of happiness, inner fulfillment and therapy

through colors: "Passion is my fuel", he tells me. "People may think you need food to function. For me it is about a constant flow of energy. I feel the joy of creating with every fibre of my body and am constantly driven by passion, a desire to create. I don't ever stop painting and love working on multiple canvases at the same time..."

I discovered Peter on social media through ground breaking gallerist Philippe Hoerle-Guggenheim, the owner of HG Contemporary in New York, who represented him at the Auckland Art Fair in New Zealand. I was instantaneously drawn to the state of well-being his art exudes and the eclectic spectrum of emotions it generates through breathtaking brush strokes of abstract expressionism. It seems as though the emotions are layering on top of each other the same way his colors do: intense and joyful, unequivocally thought-provoking and relentlessly mind blowing.

The tour of his three galleries and studio has been arranged by his beautiful wife Seraphina, reminiscent herself of an art work. If Botticelli would have painted Asian women they would have looked just like her, and her wonderful personality facilitates our special interaction, rather evocative of a longtime friendship.

If the first gallery comes across as a tribute to happiness, the second suggests almost an intimate trip to a futuristic Paradise where multiple senses are engaged through colors and diffusive music that beautifully compliments the art. It's quite obvious that the artist has a penchant for vibrant colors and creating art that can be easily perceived as therapy of the senses.

At that point my heart was already captivated as much as my eyes and a quote from "Little Prince" came to mind: it is only with the heart that one can see rightly; what is essential is invisible to the eye.

On our way to Peter's studio I catch a glimpse of the overly charming Toronto, and I am quite enchanted. The space itself is divine: it's art, art, art. Large paintings, tapestries and sculptures. An avid collector himself Peter owns beautiful pieces by Picasso, Dali, Miró, sculptures from the XVIII century... His personality is larger than life, and we connect immediately; not sure if it's our Balkan heritage that brings us so close together or the fact that he has an immense love and sense of appreciation for people.



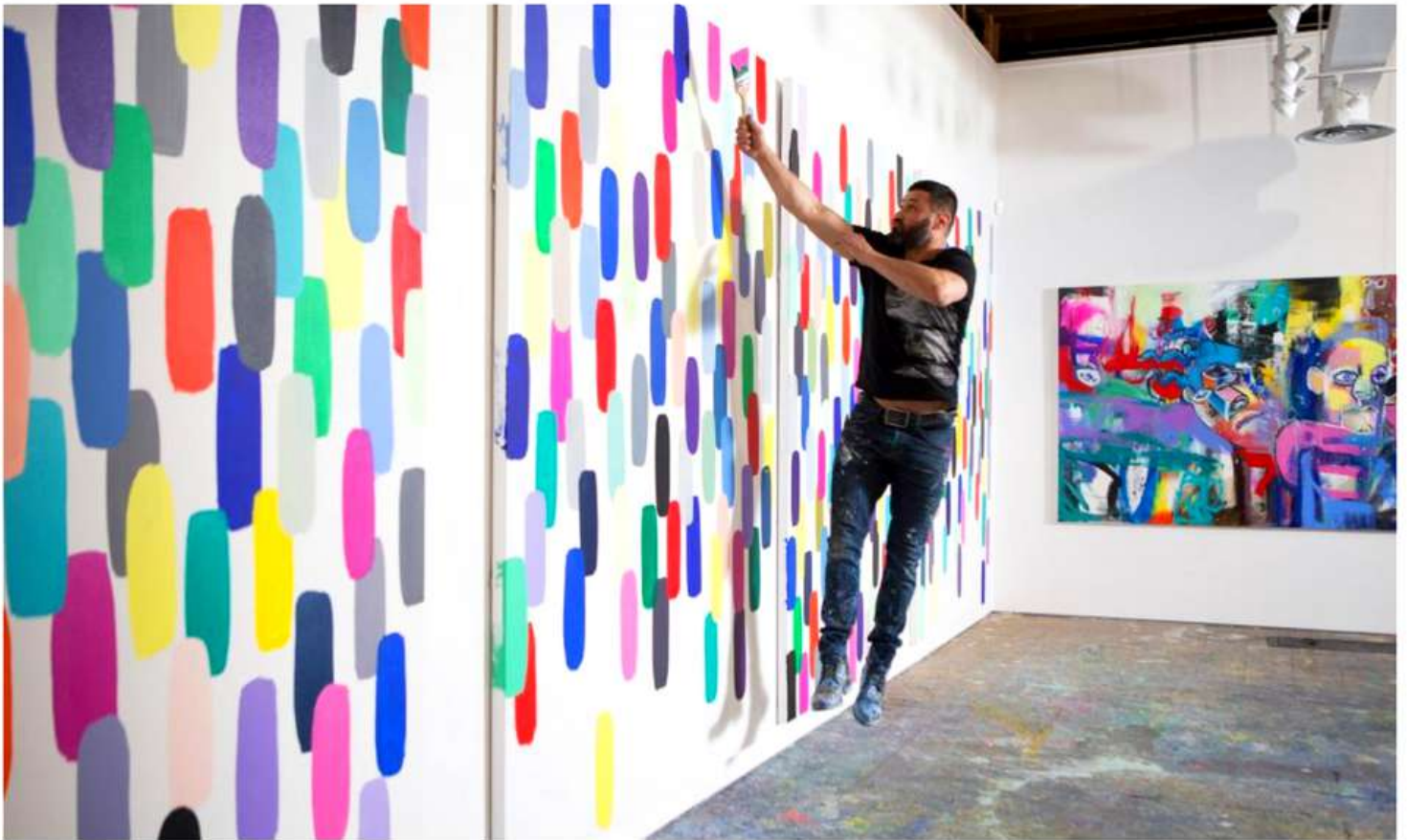
Jelly Bean #38, 2017, acrylic on canvas, 72" x 54"

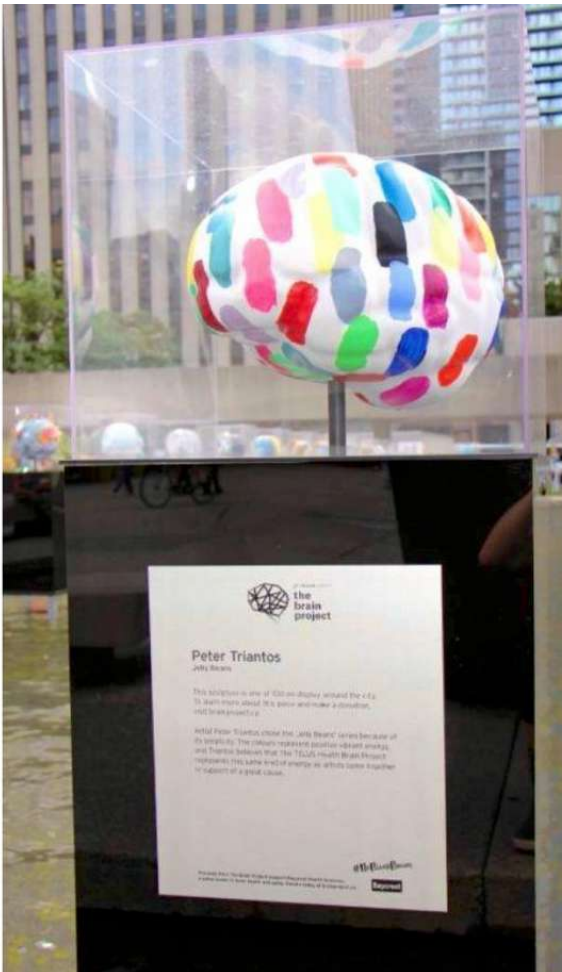
